## Melinda Cabrera President & CEO



Melinda Cabrera began serving as president and CEO of the Scholarship Foundation of Santa Barbara in August 2023. A native of Apple Valley, California, Ms. Cabrera earned a bachelor's degree in communications at Loyola Marymount University before being named assistant director of guest services at the Santa Barbara Zoo. She joined the United Way of Santa Barbara County in 2013, serving first as a community impact officer and later as director of strategic partnerships from 2016 to 2020. As the organization's vice president, Ms. Cabrera led United Way's programming and initiatives in the areas of financial empowerment, education, and crisis response and recovery. Under her leadership, the Scholarship Foundation was one of only six organizations nationwide selected by the U.S. Department of Education to conduct initial testing of the latest Free Application for Federal Student Aid in 2024. She was included in *Pacific Coast Business Times* "Top 50 Women in Business" report in 2024 and 2025.



### Pamela Gann Board Chair



Pamela Gann joined the Scholarship Foundation Board of Directors in 2018, and began serving as board chair in July 2025. Ms. Gann earned a law degree at Duke University after studying mathematics as an undergraduate at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. She went on to serve as dean of Duke Law School for 11 years before being named president of Claremont McKenna College in 1999, a post she held until 2013. Ms. Gann has held visiting faculty appointments at universities throughout the country, and has taught law and international trade at seminars and institutes in Europe and Asia. She is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations, the Pacific Council on International Policy, the International Women's Forum, and the American Law Institute, among others. Also a board director for Cottage Health, she previously served as a Santa Barbara Foundation trustee and as a board member for Direct Relief.

#### PROGRAM UPDATE

Affirming its stature as a national leader in the areas of student financial aid and advisory services, the Scholarship Foundation was among just six organizations nationwide selected by the U.S. Department of Education to conduct initial testing of the latest Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

"The flawed rollout of the FAFSA last year resulted in overwhelming stress and anxiety for students, and in some cases deterred students from submitting the application altogether," said Foundation President and CEO Melinda Cabrera. "We view our participation in this first round of testing as an extension of our longstanding commitment to community betterment through college degree attainment."

Three additional rounds of testing will take place as part of the Education Department's phased rollout of the FAFSA in advance of the form's wide-scale release by December 1.

The Scholarship Foundation's testing process involved seniors from Santa Maria, Pioneer Valley, and Ernest Righetti high schools completing the FAFSA at an in-person workshop in early October. The submitted applications were later reviewed for technical and informational errors by financial services staff at UC Santa Barbara and Westmont College.

Required by virtually all organizations that provide college financial aid, the FAFSA is typically released on October 1, but last year's iteration was delayed until late December. Ensuing technical problems further complicated admissions and funding decisions for students nationwide, prompting the Education Department's phased rollout this year.

"The Scholarship Foundation of Santa Barbara has an enduring legacy of supporting students in our community who want to pursue higher education," said Irene Neller, vice president for enrollment marketing and communications at Westmont. "Problems with last year's FAFSA rollout affected the country's most vulnerable students, so partnerships like this have become even more important."

Scholarship Foundation officials were surprised earlier this year when a longtime benefactor insisted on anonymity after donating a whopping \$1 million to the organization. Less surprising was the donor's designated honoree, former Foundation Executive Director **Billie Maunz**.

"I'm still stunned," said Billie, who headed the organization from 1990 to 2006.

"It's something I never expected. When I received the news, I thought of my parents. They didn't have the opportunity to attend college, but they provided it for their three daughters. And they would be just so proud, as is my entire family." The sizable gift will be added to an existing endowed fund that bears Billie's name, and is expected to generate about 15 undergraduate scholarships each year starting in 2025–26.

Billie took a remarkably circuitous route to becoming executive director of the Scholarship Foundation. Raised in the small East Texas town of Jacksonville, she attended Sam Houston State University in nearby Huntsville, earning degrees in political science and history and a secondary education certificate, before setting off for Washington, D.C., on a Greyhound bus. She didn't even bother to stick around for her college graduation.

A subsequent bus trip landed her in San Francisco, where she met her soon-to-be husband, Charles. Stints at an insurance company in San Franciso, a real estate development firm in Los Angeles, and her husband's law office in Santa Barbara followed.

At the Scholarship Foundation, Billie presided over an enormously consequential period of growth. Among much else, the organization established a relationship with the late George and Dale Cavalletto and the subsequent Cavalletto Charities. The Scholarship Foundation was also named beneficiary of the annual South Coast Business & Technology Awards ceremony, strengthening its connection to the local business community.

"Looking back, I can't believe I got paid to have all that fun," she said. "I'm proud of the Scholarship Foundation and the fact that it's still going strong!"

For as long as he can remember, **Edgar Olozagaste** has had a keen interest in computers. It would take a family crisis, however, for him to realize that they could be the key to his future.

The decisive catalyst was a series of heart-to-heart talks with his mother after Edgar and his siblings had been placed in foster homes. A single parent who labors arduously as a field hand, she was desperate to put the family's finances in order and reunite with her children.

Her grit inspired Edgar to make changes in his own life.

"Those talks would get to me," said Edgar, who was in ninth grade at the time. "I realized that my mom was sacrificing a lot and had already done so much for us. I also realized that I should be taking advantage of the opportunities that I had and set an example for my younger siblings."

The family came back together later that year, and his epiphany led to a gradual academic rebound at Santa Maria High School. Edgar had become an indifferent student under the emotional weight of his family's two-year ordeal, but by the 11th grade he was earning all A's.

Today, Edgar is a freshman computer science major at Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo, where he is attending as a first-generation college student with the help of a Peggy & John Maximus Scholarship.

Closer to home, he isn't waiting to finish college to help his mother. Edgar works at a local Popeyes Louisiana Kitchen franchise and contributes financially to the care of his four younger siblings.

"I don't want to be just another regular Joe," he said. "I want to be someone different. I want to help people and leave my mark on the world."



## Brenda Martinez Rios

"Receiving this scholarship means that I will have the opportunity to continue my education and pursue the career of my dreams." **Brenda Martinez Rios** already had her future mapped out as a senior at San Marcos High School last winter when she came up against a force that threatened to derail her college and career plans: the new Free Application for Federal Student Aid or FAFSA.

The error-riddled form has tormented countless students and families nationwide since its delayed rollout late last year, greatly complicating the college admissions process for many.

Fortunately for Brenda – and thousands of other Santa Barbara County students – the Scholarship Foundation was able to lend a hand. A Foundation program advisor helped her complete and file her FAFSA with time to spare.


Best of all, with guidance from the program advisor Brenda also applied to the Scholarship Foundation, and ended up receiving a Don and Sue Burrows Family Scholarship. Now a freshman biology major at Westmont College in Santa Barbara, she aspires to become a surgeon.

"Being a first-generation Latina student trying to pursue a career in the medical field has been challenging," she said. "However, I have chosen this goal because I am confident that I can realize my potential and make a difference in my community."

The oldest of three, Brenda looks after her younger siblings. Their single mother puts in long hours as a cashier. Without financial assistance from the Scholarship Foundation, she would likely have to work more to help support Brenda, putting further strain on the household.

"Thanks to this scholarship, my daughter is preparing for a better future. Thank you!" said mom Jazmin Rios.

"Receiving this scholarship means that I will have the opportunity to continue my education and pursue the career of my dreams without creating a financial burden for me and my family," said Brenda. "It opens a gateway to an education that my family would not be able to provide for me."



The Scholarship Foundation has been an indispensable partner in **Abbey Willett's** education since she graduated from San Marcos High School in 2017. After receiving Foundation support each of her four years at UCLA, she is currently attending UC Berkeley School of Law with the help of consecutive George A. Cavalletto Law Scholarships.

Now it seems the Foundation may have indirectly altered her career path as well.

When she began her legal studies, Abbey was interested in pursuing employment law. However, she is rethinking that plan following an eight-week internship at Mullen & Henzell L.L.P. through its new partnership with the Scholarship Foundation.

"I was happily surprised by how much I liked it," Abbey said of her work with the local law firm's estate planning team this past summer. She also helped attorneys in Mullen & Henzell's civil litigation and business and real estate practice groups.

"Employment law is legally and emotionally complex. Similarly, in estate planning, lawyers can help clients solve legal problems that are often entwined with their personal lives. As of now, I'm very much leaning toward it becoming my practice area."

It wasn't the first time Abbey took a deliberative approach to career planning. Upon graduating from UCLA with a bachelor's degree in international development studies in 2021, she wanted to be certain that lawyering would be a good fit, so she worked as a legal assistant at Amazon in Seattle for the next two years.

When the time came to pull the trigger on law school, she was happy to learn the Scholarship Foundation could once again help fund her studies.

"I vividly remember when I learned that I would receive a Foundation scholarship for my first year of law school, and the subsequent tears of relief," said Abbey, who will finish up at Berkeley in 2026. "I literally cried. Law school is very expensive, and these scholarships are a tremendous help. I am so grateful."



The Scholarship Foundation has forged a partnership with Mullen & Henzell L.L.P. to provide area law school students and graduates with career development opportunities in the firm's Santa Barbara office. Under the partnership, the Foundation will inform current and former scholarship recipients of available law clerk and attorney employment opportunities at Mullen & Henzell. Scholarship Foundation officials believe the program could serve as a template for collaboration with other area employers.



Scholarship Foundation program advisors spent much of the summer instructing local schoolchildren on the importance of attending college under an innovative new program presented in partnership with area youth development organizations.

As part of its "Future Scholars" program, the Foundation teamed up with United Way of Santa Barbara County and Girls Inc. of

Carpinteria, among other organizations, to present young students with information about college-level study, financial aid, careers, and related subjects. The goal is to encourage children as young as age 8 to plan for their future.

"We want to normalize the idea of college among children who might otherwise overlook it as a viable future path," said Scholarship Foundation President and CEO Melinda Cabrera. "If we can encourage them at a young age to view college as a realistic option following high school, they are more likely to apply themselves academically and consider their career interests in relation to their studies."

The Scholarship Foundation's "Future Scholars" summer initiative principally involved

partnerships with Girls Inc. of Carpinteria's Eureka! program and United Way of Santa Barbara County's Fun in the Sun program.

Under the Eureka! partnership, Foundation program advisors worked with junior high school students from Carpinteria, providing them with a rudimentary understanding of college and financial aid through a series of presentations and activities.

"The Scholarship Foundation played a vital role in the Eureka! program by introducing our girls to both college and non-college pathways after high school," said Girls Inc. of Carpinteria Executive Director Jamie Collins. "Foundation advisors made the next steps feel accessible and achievable."



# For the second consecutive year, the South Coast Business & Technology (SCBT) Awards ceremony grossed a record total on behalf of the Scholarship Foundation of Santa Barbara.




