Melinda Cabrera President & CEO



Melinda Cabrera began serving as president and CEO of the Scholarship Foundation of Santa Barbara in August 2023. A native of Apple Valley, California, Ms. Cabrera earned a bachelor's degree in communications at Loyola Marymount University before being named assistant director of guest services at the Santa Barbara Zoo. She joined the United Way of Santa Barbara County in 2013, serving first as a community impact officer and later as director of strategic partnerships from 2016 to 2020. As the organization's vice president, Ms. Cabrera led United Way's programming and initiatives in the areas of financial empowerment, education, and crisis response and recovery. Under her leadership, the Scholarship Foundation was one of only six organizations nationwide selected by the U.S. Department of Education to conduct initial testing of the latest Free Application for Federal Student Aid in 2024. She was included in *Pacific Coast Business Times'* "Top 50 Women in Business" report in 2024 and 2025.



Pamela Gann Board Chair



Pamela Gann joined the Scholarship Foundation Board of Directors in 2018, and began serving as board chair in July 2025. Ms. Gann earned a law degree at Duke University after studying mathematics as an undergraduate at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. She went on to serve as dean of Duke Law School for 11 years before being named president of Claremont McKenna College in 1999, a post she held until 2013. Ms. Gann has held visiting faculty appointments at universities throughout the country, and has taught law and international trade at seminars and institutes in Europe and Asia. She is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations, the Pacific Council on International Policy, the International Women's Forum, and the American Law Institute, among others. Also a board director for Cottage Health, she previously served as a Santa Barbara Foundation trustee and as a board member for Direct Relief.





Affirming once again its stature as a national leader in the areas of student financial aid and advisory services, the Scholarship Foundation successfully conducted testing of the latest Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) over the summer.

Conducted over the course of a four-hour workshop at the Santa Maria High School Library on August 12, the testing involved 104 high school seniors, together with parents, siblings, Santa Maria High School counselors, and representatives from various advocacy organizations and agencies.

The Scholarship Foundation was the only organization in California and one of just 11 nationwide selected by the U.S. Department of Education to conduct FAFSA testing this year. In 2024, the Foundation was one of only six organizations nationwide selected to conduct FAFSA testing.


Required by virtually all organizations that provide college financial aid, the FAFSA was beset with technical problems in 2023 and 2024, prompting the Department of Education's testing initiative this year and last.

The Scholarship Foundation has expanded its innovative "Future Scholars" summer program, forging alliances with four new partner organizations to broaden instructional opportunities for area elementary and junior high school students. The program's goal is to encourage and inspire students as young as age 8 to plan for college or vocational school.

The idea first came to Julie Weaver as she gathered with colleagues at David J. Sanchez Sr. Elementary School to celebrate former students who had gone on to enjoy academic success at nearby Santa Maria High.

"We say things like, 'Once a lion always a lion," she said, in reference to the school's mascot. "I just thought some follow-through would be very meaningful, that perhaps we could support our students as they progressed in their studies."

And with that, the conceptual basis for the David J. Sanchez Elementary Scholarship was born. Pulling together funding and establishing a partnership with the Scholarship Foundation would take a bit more time and effort, however.

A teacher for 33 years, including 11 at Sanchez, Julie was thrust into the role of scholarship organizer, which she took on reluctantly, though she is quick to emphasize the project's collaborative nature.


After meeting with Scholarship Foundation President and CEO Melinda Cabrera in the spring of 2024, she spearheaded fundraising. Current and former teachers and staff ultimately contributed funds, as did the Sanchez Elementary School Parent Teacher Committee.

"Our goal was to have a broad base of support, which we felt was the best way to ensure the scholarship's long-term viability," said Julie.

The inaugural David J. Sanchez Elementary Scholarship was awarded last May to Valeria Barajas, who attended the school from 2012-2019. She is attending UC San Diego this fall as a freshman human biology major in preparation for a career in nursing.

The Scholarship Foundation oversaw the selection process in accordance with criteria put in place by Julie and her team. Otherwise, it has been a homegrown effort.

"Many local families have a generational connection to Sanchez – parents have attended the school, and now their children are attending. This scholarship and the way we've set it up to be sustainable, honors that unique community relationship," said Julie.



Anthony Delacruz has some hard-earned advice for those grappling with adversity: practice gratitude.

"My grandma has been my beacon of hope. She told me that gratitude could be the anchor that keeps us grounded in the hurricanes of our lives," he said. "Her words galvanized my resilience."

At the time, Anthony and his family were deep in crisis. After fire gutted their Lompoc home, daily life had become a disorienting blur of motel rooms and fitful attempts to regain a sense of normalcy. The family ended up crowding into a small trailer home.

Adding to the tragedy's sting: Their former home was itself a symbol of familial resilience, the culmination of a years-long struggle to overcome financial hardship. The loss hit Anthony especially hard.


"My grades plummeted as I fell into a deep depression, feeling numb and consumed by despair," said Anthony, then a sophomore at Lompoc High School. "Life felt meaningless, like I had been thrown into a bottomless pit with no escape."

His grandmother's gentle encouragement proved miraculously rejuvenating, however, spurring him to rebuild his academic standing. In the process, he rediscovered his fascination with human biology.

Today, Anthony is a freshman biology major at Santa Clara University, which he hopes will be his first step toward becoming a physician. The Scholarship Foundation helped get him there, awarding him a Robert Ormes Dougan Endowed Scholarship.

"When I received support from the Scholarship Foundation, it felt like someone out there believed in me. It helped lift a weight I was carrying quietly for a long time," he said.

"Thanks to the Foundation, I can focus on my future – on medical school and on becoming the kind of doctor who shows up for people when they need it most. The Foundation didn't just help with tuition. It helped restore hope."





Natalie Adalpa is still two years away from earning her bachelor's degree in sociology, but she already has a career in mind. The UC Santa Barbara junior aspires to be a clinical psychologist and help young people navigate adolescent angst.

"A lot of teenagers are overwhelmed with emotions and feel unheard. I want to lessen their anxiety and provide them with a supportive environment in which they can examine their feelings and gain personal insight," said the San Marcos High School graduate.

Natalie has an important ally in her academic work: Valle Verde, where her father works as a cook. In partnership with the Scholarship Foundation, the Santa Barbara senior living community annually awards college scholarships to employees and the children of employees, this year awarding 18 scholarships totaling \$100,000. Natalie was among the recipients, having received Valle Verde Scholarships each of the last two years.

"It feels amazing to receive this support. It is truly a blessing," she said. "My family is working class, and my parents couldn't possibly afford to contribute these added funds to my education. This support has enabled me to enjoy a complete college experience at UCSB. I am very grateful."

Natalie's primary source of support remains her close-knit family, particularly parents Manuela and Pedro, who emigrated from a small town in Guanajuato, Mexico, as young adults and have worked hard to support their five children in their adopted country.

"My parents are the main reason I'm in this position today," she said.

With help from Valle Verde and the Scholarship Foundation, her future looks brighter than ever.

"I am excited to continue on this path, embracing every opportunity that will contribute to my personal and professional growth," said Natalie.



Education has been an enduring priority in **Joanne Freeman's** long life.

"My parents always wanted me to go to college and told me every chance they got," said the 96-year-old Vista del Monte resident. "They hadn't gone to college themselves, but education was very important to them."

Their urgings had the desired effect. Decades before the term was in regular use, Joanne set out from her hometown of Pasadena to become a first-generation student at Santa Barbara College of the University of California, an antecedent of UCSB. Once there, she decided she wanted to teach and switched majors from sociology to education.

"I did my student teaching here and was immediately hired. That felt good because I knew I had a place to go," she said.

So began her 43-year career as a local educator, most of it she spent teaching special needs students and testing them for learning disabilities.

Early in her career, Joanne earned a master's degree in special education, and she continued to take classes on a wide range of subjects well into her 80s. "Life is learning and there's always room to learn something new," she said.

Joanne began supporting the Scholarship Foundation in 2003, and a decade later established the George and Joanne Freeman Scholarship to honor her late husband. She also interviewed Foundation applicants for many years until the age of 91.

"Interviewing the students was always memorable. Knowing that I was helping kids go to school and talking with them was extremely gratifying," said Joanne, who has now donated more than \$150,000 to the Scholarship Foundation.

She also supports the Cancer Foundation of Santa Barbara and contributes to the Vista del Monte Resident Assistance Fund.

"My family has always tried to help those in need. Supporting the Scholarship Foundation is a good choice, a wise choice because you're helping others help themselves," she said.

*J. Taylor Woodward *David and Susan Yossem When he was a financial planner, **Bruce Micheel** regularly advised clients to include a provision in their estate plans benefiting their favorite charities or nonprofit organizations.

"That way, they could continue supporting those organizations long after they had passed," said Bruce, who worked at Smith Barney and later Merrill Lynch before retiring in 2018. "I came to realize that I should heed my own advice."

That realization occurred to him in 2011, as the Scholarship Foundation was gearing up to celebrate its 50th anniversary. As part of their commitment to the associated fundraising effort, Bruce and wife **Kathleen** joined the Scholars Circle.

"Scholars Circle members have a lasting legacy at the Scholarship Foundation, one that will help local students far into the future," said Bruce, explaining the couple's thinking at the time.

In fact, the Micheels have supported the Scholarship Foundation since 1991, the year Bruce joined the Foundation's Board of Directors (he went on to serve as Board president from 2001 to 2003), and have now donated nearly \$80,000 to the organization over the last 34 years.

"We believe there is no better way to invest in future generations than to fund educational opportunities for young people,"



said Kathleen, a retired psychotherapist whose parents were both educators.

"Education is in our history, and we feel strongly that scholarships level the playing field for those who would otherwise not be able to go to college."

These days the Micheels busy themselves with travel, pickleball, and indulging their 10 grandchildren. They never tire of encountering former scholarship recipients who have done well for themselves.

"Being a part of the organization for so long, it's gratifying to see people come full circle – they were scholarship recipients and now they're doctors, dentists, lawyers, etc.," said Bruce. "That's one of the things that makes the Foundation so special."



For the third consecutive year, the South Coast Business & Technology (SCBT) Awards ceremony grossed record proceeds (\$333,300) on behalf of the Scholarship Foundation.

Ten standout organizations and individuals were honored during the 2025 ceremony, which took place June 17 at the Hilton Santa Barbara Beachfront Resort. The annual awards recognize innovation, leadership, and success in the area's business and technology sectors.

The ceremony included remarks by SCBT scholarship recipient Jennifer Perez, a biomedical engineering major at Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo.

"I want to express my deepest gratitude to the Scholarship Foundation and to all those who have contributed to the South Coast Business and Technology Fund for making this moment possible," she said.
